

BAN THE USE OF SOLITARY CONFINEMENT IN DC'S JAILS

The **ERASE** Act was introduced by Councilmember Nadeau and is co-sponsored by Councilmembers Allen, Bonds, Henderson, Lewis George, McDuffie, Parker, and R. White. The Judiciary Committee should schedule a hearing on the ERASE Act now. Then, DC Council should pass the ERASE Solitary Act this Council Period and fund it.

What is solitary confinement?

- The UN defines solitary confinement—22+ hours of daily isolation—as **torture** when used for more than 15 days.
- DC's terms like administrative segregation, protective custody, disciplinary housing, or safe cells align with the UN's definition of torture.


What would this bill change?

- Bans most solitary confinement in DC jails, requiring at least eight hours of daily out-of-cell time, with strict limits on medical isolation and suicide watch.
- Requires data reporting on solitary confinement, improves the grievance process, and permits lawsuits against DOC for violations.
